"We're excited to support this project which leverages our technology to find the very best coverage on an important beat and fuel a hub for high-quality information," says Perigon CEO Joshua Dziabiak. "We hope to explore more use cases like this in the future, and continue supporting experts, journalists, and academics with our tools."

James Borton is a foreign correspondent who has been reporting on Southeast Asia for more than 30 years. He is a past non-resident fellow at the Stimson Center, US-Asia Institute, and is currently a non-resident Senior Fellow at the Foreign Policy Institute of the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS). He is joined in this venture by David Hessen, a recent graduate of Johns Hopkins SAIS.
